Drivers are eager to compete for the first time in Morven Park’s beautiful new outdoor equestrian arenas. Phase I of a multi-year revitalization of Morven Park’s Equestrian Center was recently completed, providing three new arenas with superb footing as well as exceptional spectator vantage points.

“The Carriage Pleasure Show & Combined Test is a highlight of our annual show calendar, and we’re so pleased to welcome carriage drivers and spectators for this special weekend,” said Sheryl Williams, Morven Park’s Executive Director. “The Pleasure Drive on Sunday morning is a wonderful opportunity to introduce a broader public audience to the majesty of horse and carriage as they stop in the shade of ancient oak trees in Morven Park’s historic gardens.”

Spectators are also encouraged to visit Morven Park’s Winmill Carriage Museum, which is open noon to 5 p.m., Thursdays through Mondays for the remainder of the summer. The Winmill Carriage Museum currently houses a Landalet carriage, which is a coupe version of the Ascot Landau carriage seen around the world as it transported the Duke and Duchess of Sussex in the Carriage Procession following their ceremony at Windsor Castle.
