## Morven Park Announces Expanded Summer Tour Schedule and Free Admission for Military Families

LEESBURG, VA – Just in time for summer vacations, Morven Park announces two new opportunities for Park visitors. From June 14 through August 24, the Park is offering three additional days each week to tour the Davis Mansion, the Winmill Carriage Museum, and the Museum of Hounds & Hunting. The popular historical attractions will be open Thursdays through Mondays from noon to 5 p.m., with the last tour starting at 4:00 p.m. Additionally, Morven Park is providing free admission to active duty military personnel and their families until Labor Day.

Morven Park is proud to be a part of Blue Star Museums, a collaboration among the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA), Blue Star Families, the Department of Defense, and more than 2,000 museums across America to offer free admission to the nation's active duty military personnel and their families during the summer. NEA Chairman Jane Chu stated, "Visiting a museum is a great way to get to know a community—whether it's in your hometown or a stop on a road trip. We appreciate the enthusiasm of museums all across the country who open their doors for military and their families to spend time together and have new arts experiences." "It is an honor to share Morven Park's mansion and museums with our service men and women and their families this summer," said Sheryl Williams, Morven Park's Executive Director. "The expanded schedule provides 25 opportunities each week for our guests to discover the history of Morven Park and step back into a bygone era. Visitors are encouraged to make a day of it and bring a picnic lunch to enjoy in the gardens, hike through our two miles of woodland trails, or take a leisurely stroll through the picturesque grounds of the Park."

Visitors to the Davis Mansion will hear stories of the civic and social lives of former Virginia Governor Westmoreland Davis and his wife, Marguerite, during the first half of the 20th century. The Davises' personal items and extensive collection of arts and antiques acquired during their travels throughout the world will be described as guests pass through living areas that include a lavish entry hall, ornate drawing room, elaborate dining area, grand billiard room, and well-stocked library, as well as an expansive kitchen and charming personal quarters. After the mansion tour, visitors can discover the unique collection of horse-drawn vehicles housed in the Winmill Carriage Museum, plus the art, artifacts, and memorabilia of foxhunting found in the Museum of Hounds & Hunting.
