# Saturday, July 5 Classes & Divisions

<u>Novice Whip/Horse/Pony</u>: Any turnout of single horse or pony may compete in the Novice Whip division under the following conditions: (ADS Article 31) – Novice entries are ineligible for Novice classes after winning at least one first place ribbon in each of three ADS-recognized and/or USEF-licensed Carriage Pleasure driving competitions.

Open: Open to all horses/ponies and drivers

## Class Descriptions

## **Turnout**

A pleasure driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the performance and quality of each turnout. To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot, and strong trot. To stand quietly and to rein back. To be judged: 70% on the condition, fit and appropriateness of harness and vehicle, neatness and appropriateness of attire and overall impression; 30% on performance, manners and way of going.

## Working

A pleasure driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the suitability of the horse to provide a pleasant drive. To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot. To stand quietly, both on the rail and while lined up, and to rein back. All entries chosen for a workout may be worked both ways of the arena at any gait requested by the judge and may be asked to execute appropriate tests. To be judged: 70% on performance, manners and way of going of the horse(s); 20% on the condition and fit of harness and vehicle; 10% on neatness of attire.

## Reinsmanship

A pleasure driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the ability and skill of the driver. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot. Drivers shall be required to rein back. All drivers chosen for a workout may be worked at any gait requested by the judge and may be asked to execute appropriate tests. The driver should be seated comfortably on the box so as to be relaxed and effective. Either the one or two-handed method of driving is acceptable. Common to both methods, the elbows and arms should be close to the body with an allowing but steady hand enabling a consistent "feel" of the horse's mouth. Drivers should not be penalized or rewarded for using one general style over another. To be judged: 75% on handling of reins and whip, control, posture, and overall impression of driver; 25% on the condition of harness and vehicle and neatness of attire.

## Ladies to Drive

A class in which entries are judged primarily on the suitability of the turnout to be driven by a lady with emphasis on manners. To be shown both ways of the arena at a working walk, a relaxed walk with slight contact, slow trot, working trot, and strong trot. Must rein back without resistance and stand quietly for up to one minute at any location in the arena. To be judged 50% on manners, elegance and suitability of the turnout for a lady, 25% on skill of the driver, 25% on Overall Impression.

## <u>Gentlemen to Drive</u>

A class in which entries are judged primarily on the suitability of the turnout to be driven by a gentleman with emphasis on appropriate manners. To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot. May show a degree of boldness but not excessive speed. Must stand still in the line-up and rein back willingly. To be judged 50% on the suitability of the turnout for a gentleman, 25% on the skill of the driver, 25% on Overall Impression.

### Pick Your Route - Cones

To be driven over a course of obstacles (paired markers) with no set route. Not to exceed 20 obstacles. Typically, obstacles in this type of class are not measured for each entry but are set at 80 inches (200 cm) at the start of the competition, and only reset in the event of a knockdown. After passing through the Start markers, the driver shall proceed through each obstacle to the designated Finish markers, choosing his own route. Each obstacle to be negotiated once and only once, but may be approached from either direction. Course faults are scored as penalty seconds and are added to the driver's elapsed time. Placings are determined on a low total time basis.

## Gambler's Choice - Cones

To be driven over a course of unnumbered obstacles each carrying a specific point value. Each driver has the same allowed time to negotiate as many obstacles as possible. Each obstacle is assigned a point value according to its degree of difficulty and each driver tries to amass as high a score as possible within the time allowed. After passing through the Start markers, the driver may drive through the obstacles, in any order, from any direction. Each obstacle may be driven twice, but not in succession. If driven a third time, no points will be awarded. No obstacle may be re-driven once it has been disturbed. (Exception: obstacles which are designed to be knocked down.) No points will be awarded for an incorrectly completed obstacle. If the obstacle is incorrectly driven, but not disturbed, it may be attempted again. If a horse should refuse or run out at an obstacle without disturbing it, the driver may elect not to attempt it and may drive to another obstacle without penalty. The obstacle may be attempted later. If it is correctly driven the appropriate points will be recorded. A signal will sound at the end of the allowed time and the driver must then exit through the Finish markers where the total time on the course will be recorded. If the signal sounds when the competitor is committed to an obstacle, the competitor may complete the obstacle and receive the appropriate points, then proceed through the finish markers for total time to be recorded. Whether or not the competitor was committed to the last obstacle at the signal will be left to the discretion of the judge. Dislodging a start or finish marker will incur a penalty of 5% of the total points accumulated by the entry. Break to canter will be penalized as follows (incident penalties are cumulative): 1st incident = 5% of total points accumulated; 2<sup>nd</sup> incident = an additional 5% of total points accumulated; 3<sup>rd</sup> incident = an additional 5% of total points accumulated; 4th incident = elimination.

## Concours d'Elegance

A pleasure driving class in which the essence of the competition is the word "Elegance". The winner will be the turnout which, in the opinion of the judge, presents the most elegant effect. This will include vehicle, harness, appointments, horse(s), driver, passengers, grooms, etc., but above all, general impression is most important. Vehicle and harness may be inspected to ensure thoughtful restoration and careful maintenance. Attention will be paid to the personal appearance of the driver, grooms, and passengers as it contributes to the overall picture. Performance will not be judged unless it detracts from the elegance of the turnout. An honorary judge may assist with the judging of this class.

## <u>Carriage Dog</u>

A pleasure driving class judged primarily on the suitability of the dog to serve as a companion (maximum one dog per carriage). To be judged both ways in the arena at a walk, slow trot and working trot. The dog should be standing, lying down or seated on the vehicle or should run behind, beside or at the axle of the vehicle. The dog must be under control at all times. The dog must not be led on the ground from the vehicle or be restrained by being tied to the vehicle, driver or passenger. The driver should not hold the dog, and the dog should not interfere with the driver in any way. The dog may be of any breed. To be judged 60% on the suitability of the dog to serve as a companion; 30% on the performance, manners and way of going of the horse(s); 10% on the overall impression of the turnout, including the dog. Entries with a dog clearly not under control may be eliminated. The judge may elicit input from the spectators, in the form of applause to aid in making her decision.

## Clarification of Gaits

The following description constitutes the American Driving Society's approved standard for performance of each of the required gaits in the various divisions of a pleasure driving competition.

Walk: A free, regular and unconstrained walk of moderate extension ideal. The horse should walk energetically but calmly, with even and determined pace. The walk is a four beat gait.

Slow Trot: The horse should maintain forward impulsion while showing submission to the bit. The trot is slower and more collected, but not to the degree required in the dressage collected trot. However, the horse should indicate willingness to be driven on the bit while maintaining a steady cadence.

Working Trot: This is the pace between the strong and the slow trot and more round than the strong trot. The horse goes forward freely and straight; engaging the hind legs with good hock action; on a taut, but light, rein; the position being balanced and unconstrained. The steps should be as even as possible. The hind feet touch the ground in the footprints of the forefeet. The degree of energy and impulsion displayed at the working trot denotes clearly the degree of suppleness and balance of the horse.

Strong Trot: Shows a clear but not excessive, increase in speed and lengthening of stride while remaining well balanced and showing appropriate lateral flexion on turns. Light contact to be maintained. Excessive speed will be penalized. The term used for calling this gait is "Trot-On".

**Halt**: Horse and vehicle should be brought to a complete square stop, without abruptness or veering. At the halt the horse should stand attentive, motionless and straight, the weight evenly distributed over all four legs, and be ready to move off at the slightest indication from the driver.

**Rein back**: Rein back is defined as a backward movement in which the legs are raised and set down simultaneously in diagonal pairs with the hind legs remaining well in line. To be performed in two parts:

- 1. Rein back at least four steps, unhurried, with head flexed and straight, pushing the vehicle back evenly in a straight line. The driver should use quiet aids and light contact.
- 2. Move forward willingly to former position using the same quiet aids.
- 3. Road Coaches and Park Drags are not to be asked to back up in the show

## General Rules

- 1. Morven Park Pleasure Show, the American Driving Society, their committee, officials and staff, and any property owners of any such land which may be used for any aspect of the Competition will not be responsible for any claim resulting from injury or injuries to any person, horse/pony, or loss or damage to property incurred on the show grounds, staging/stabling area, or on any course. Furthermore, in all situations the driver assumes the responsibility and the liability for any injury or damage to himself/herself, to groom or grooms, and/or passenger/passengers riding with them in the vehicle. All persons riding on any vehicle must sign a waiver which must be on file with the show secretary. Competitors in violation are subject to disqualification from the show.
- 2. The entry fee for all classes is \$18. Entries open on May 21 and close June 17, 2014. Must be postmarked by June 17. No entries accepted by phone, however, we will provisionally take post entries on line or by fax after June 17. Post entries will be accepted up to the closing of the office the day before the class provided the class has not been closed, for a fee of \$25 per class. Make checks payable to Morven Park. Management has the right to decline any entry. All entries must be paid before entering the class.
- 3. The Committee reserves the right to decline any entry and/or return any entry fee before or during the competition without being liable for any compensation. In case of horses/ponies being entered and not exhibited, entry fees will be forfeited, unless a veterinarian certificate attests to the inability of the animal to participate due to injury or illness. The certificate must be received before the beginning of the show, July 5, 2014. A \$25 administrative fee will be assessed to refunded entries. Stall fees are not refundable.
- 4. The Committee reserves the right to combine or divide or cancel classes or divisions if the number of entries warrants such a change. If classes are cancelled by the Organizing Committee, entry fees will be refunded by mail by August 5, 2014.
- 5. Ribbons will be awarded to six competitors in each class. Points will be awarded towards Show Champion & Reserve in this manner:

- 6. Juniors are those individuals that will not be 19 years of age on or before December 31, 2014. All juniors in all competitions must wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds current ASTM/SEI standards for equestrian use and carry the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. Failure to comply will result in elimination.
- 7. Drivers and passengers will be dressed conservatively. All drivers must carry a whip, wear a hat or helmet, apron and gloves while driving their equine.
- 8. Virginia regulations provide that all animals must have proof of negative Equine Infectious Anemia to be <u>current within one year</u> through the show date (July 5, 2014). Please submit with registration. Numbers will not be assigned without payment of entry fees, properly signed entry forms, ADS disclaimer or current negative Coggins.
- 9. All dogs on show grounds must be restrained by a leash. No exceptions! Any dog not so restrained will be detained and owner will be subject to fines.
- 10. No schooling is allowed on the cross country course on Saturday. Schooling is permitted on the racetrack and indoor arenas on Friday, Saturday and Sunday (July 4-6).
- 11. Permission may be granted from the show committee for antique vehicles with wire wheels. VSE's are permitted to use wire wheeled vehicles. Any safe vehicle is permitted to compete as per ADS rules. (Includes marathon/utility vehicles).
- 12. In the event of a breakdown in the obstacle classes, either to harness or vehicle, which necessitate a halt for repair, the competitor is to make only those adjustments/repairs necessary for the safe removal of their turnout from the obstacle course.
- 13. The pleasure driving horse may be of any breed, color or size. Very Small Equines are those less than 39 inches (9.3 hands high). All animals taller than 14.2 hands high are horses.
- 14. A pair or tandem of horses/ponies or VSE/Miniature Horse Multiples (four-in-hand, unicorn or tandem turnouts) must carry a groom or passenger capable of lending assistance in case of difficulty; a unicorn/four-in-hand of horses/ponies must carry two grooms or passengers capable of lending assistance in case of difficulty. Failure to comply entails elimination.
- 15. Bridles should fit snugly to prevent catching on a vehicle or other pieces of harness and under no circumstance or condition should a bridle ever be removed from a horse or pony while it is still put to a vehicle. Removing the bridle or detaching the reins before unhitching, anywhere on the show grounds will result in INSTANT elimination.

- 16. Sunday's pleasure driving maps will be available Friday, July 4, 2014 for the Pleasure Drive. Pick Your Route cones and Gambler's Choice obstacles will have a map posted at both the course and official scoreboard.
- 17. Pick Your Route and Gambler's Choice classes may be driven from either direction at the start and may be driven from either direction at the finish without regard to the direction taken at the start. Paired markers will be set at 2 meters for all turnouts.
- 18. The Morven Park Pleasure Show and Drive is an American Driving Society (ADS) recognized show; therefore, all drivers must be either ADS members or pay a \$30.00 ADS non-member fee.
- 19. All exhibitors are automatically entered into the Concours d'Elegance class. Competitors will be selected based upon the overall turnout as presented throughout the show. The class winner will be selected from these individuals in the final class of the show.
- **20. Cantering is prohibited in all classes.** Breaks to canter are defined as three full strides if an advantage has been gained; six full strides if no advantage has been gain (ADS Article 28A). Prolonged cantering will be penalized according to class specifications. In the case of multiples, all horses in a turnout must break to incur penalties.

## **GENERAL INFORMATION**

The Secretary's office will open Friday, July 4<sup>th</sup> after 2:00 pm and by 7:00 am on Saturday. You will check in with the secretary to pick up your numbers, cones maps and verify your entry. Food will be available for purchase on site at the Café on Saturday (breakfast & lunch).

## **Social Events:**

<u>Friday:</u> For those arriving Friday afternoon, please join us for complimentary refreshments and enjoy the fireworks on the hill by the racecourse at 8:30 pm. Local competitors are welcome to come and enjoy the evening as well!

<u>Saturday</u>: Join us for a competitor's party Saturday evening 6:30 pm – 9:30 pm in the Winmill Carriage Museum. \$40 per person includes open wine & beer bar, hors d'oeuvres, and buffet dinner & dessert. Children 12 & under \$25. Guests are invited to enjoy the carriage collection and will be provided complimentary passes for Mansion tours.

<u>Sunday</u>: Morven Park would like to encourage all Saturday competitors to stay for the weekend and participate in a non-competitive pleasure drive throughout the property. Cost of drive is \$35; includes refreshments which will be served at various locations on the cross country course. Optional cones course will be available and professional photographer on site for photo opportunities in front of the Mansion.

## **Stabling**

Morven Park has a total of 135 10 x 10 permanent box stalls. The cost of \$100 per stall includes initial 2 bales of shavings and covers stabling from Friday through Sunday evenings. Shavings are available for purchase at \$8.00 per bag. Tack stalls are \$100. Stripping of stall is not required at departure.

## Veterinary/Health Requirements

Health certificates are not required. Negative Coggins within 1 year of show date must be included with each entry.

#### Camping on Grounds

\$30 per night; pre-registration required. Electrical hookups are limited and not guaranteed; (20 AMP maximum). No sewage hook-ups, no dumping of grey water. Tent camping not permitted. Electric and water hookups are not permitted from barns. Campfires and grills are strictly prohibited.

## Directions to the Equestrian Center

Morven Park's Equestrian Center is located one mile North of the town of Leesburg off Route 15 ByPass on Rt. 740 (Tutt Lane). Turn onto Route 740 (Tutt Lane), go 1/2 mile - entrance on left. DO NOT follow signs in Leesburg for "Morven Park" or GPS directions to "Morven Park".

### From the Washington Beltway (I-495)

- Take the Dulles Toll road (Rt. 267) west
- At exit 9, Rt. 28 (Sully Rd) turn right and go north to Rt. 7
- Exit west to Leesburg on Rt. 7
- Take the Leesburg By-Pass (Rt. 15.)
- Go North on Rt. 15 By-Pass to just beyond the turnback to Business 15
- Turn left on Tutt Lane (Rt. 740)
- Continue 1/2 mile to the Morven Park entrance on the left

#### Option from I-495

- -Take the Dulles Greenway from the Dulles Toll Road (direct)
- To Rt. 15 By-Pass north at Leesburg
- Go north on By-Pass and go North on Rt. 15
- By-Pass to just beyond the turnback to Business 15
- Turn left on Tutt Lane (Rt. 740)
- Continue 1/2 mile to the Morven Park entrance on the left

## From Points West

- Take Rt. 7 east to the Leesburg By-Pass (Rt. 15) north or take I-66 east or Rt. 50 east to Rt. 15 north
- At Leesburg take By-Pass north and go North on Rt. 15 By-Pass
- Turn left on Tutt Lane (Rt. 740) continue 1/2 mile to the Morven Park entrance on the left

#### From Points North

- Take Rt. 15 South. Just north of the Rt. 15 Business and By-Pass split, turn right onto Tutt Lane (Rt. 740)
- Continue 1/2 mile to the Morven Park entrance on the left.

#### From Points South

- From Warrenton take Rt. 29 to Rt. 15.
- Turn left onto Rt. 15 north.
- From Manassas take Rt. 234 northwest to Rt. 15.
- Turn right on Rt. 15 north; continue to Leesburg.
- Turn right onto Rt. 15 By-Pass; head north and go North on Rt. 15 By-Pass
- To just beyond the turnback to Business 15.
- Turn left on Tutt Lane (Rt. 740) continue 1/2 mile to the Morven Park entrance on the left.
